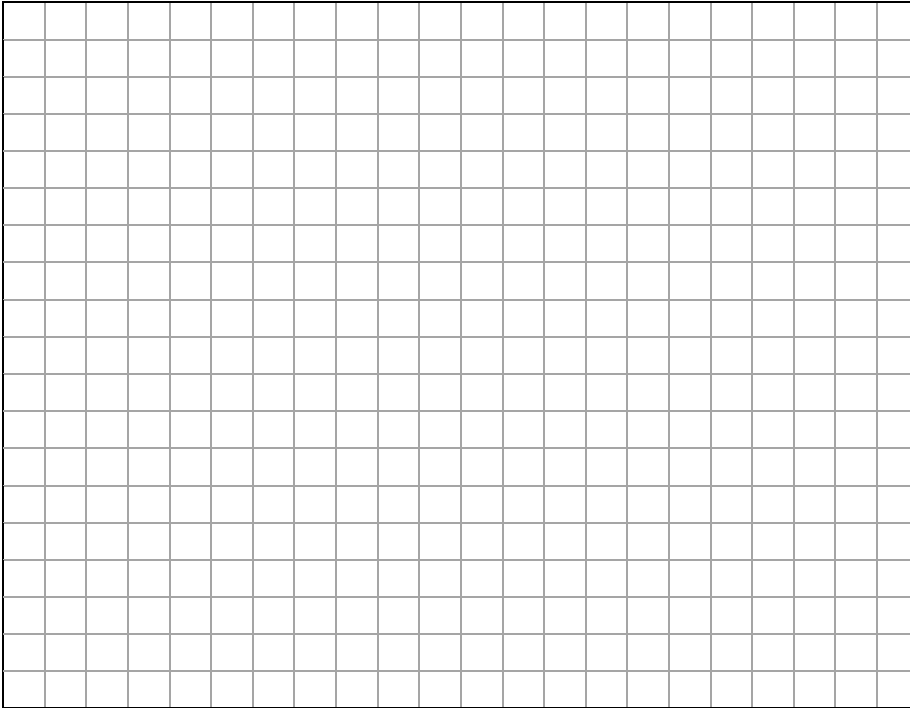


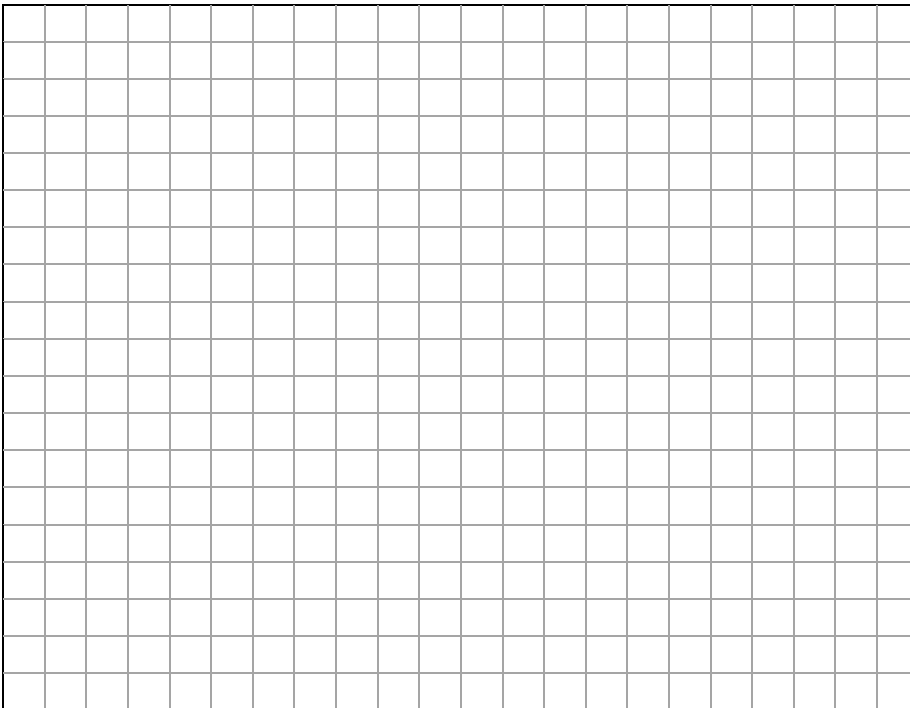


1. Draw a floor plan on the grids below for each floor of your home.

8. What should you do with all keys to outside doors and windows?

In a room at the front with a window that opens	Knock on neighbours' doors and shout "Help! Fire"	To stop smoke coming in to the room	Never go back inside
Keep them somewhere everyone in the house can find them. Near the door is best		Shut all doors before going to bed	Shout to wake everyone up.
